President's update

Dear SESAM colleagues and friends

As we approach the end of the year, first and foremost I hope that we can all remain well and enjoy some time with our families and loved ones over the Christmas period. Most of us will, of course, continue to have on-call duties and professional responsibilities, but I sincerely hope that everyone can find moments for rest and reflection whenever possible.

Looking back on the past year, the results we have achieved together are truly remarkable. SESAM has experienced extraordinary growth across all key dimensions of our community: membership numbers, attendance at our Annual Meeting, growth of our Communities of Practice in numbers and size, accredited centres and the expansion of our network of affiliated societies and strategic partners. These achievements reflect not only the increasing relevance of simulation in healthcare education, but also the credibility, energy, and vision of SESAM as a professional and scientific society.

This year has also seen SESAM strongly represented at national and international congresses, both across Europe and beyond. Importantly, these events were not limited to simulation-focused meetings, but also included major events dedicated to patient safety more broadly, which ultimately represents our core mission. Our presence at these forums demonstrates our strong commitment to global engagement and collaboration. They provide valuable opportunities to share expertise, learn from others, and advocate for simulation as a fundamental tool to improve patient safety, while further reinforcing SESAM's role as a key international reference in healthcare education and safety.

Another major achievement of 2025 has been the recognition of our scientific journal, Advances in Simulation, which has now received an Impact Factor of 4.7. This is a significant milestone for SESAM and for the entire simulation community. I would like to express a special thank you to our publisher, but above all to the Editorial Board and its Editor-in-Chief, whose vision, dedication, and scientific rigor made this accomplishment possible.

Following the great success of our last Annual Meeting in Valencia, we are already very excited about the 2026 Annual Meeting in Lyon, which we will organize with the invaluable support of our French colleagues from SoFraSimS. The congress will include sessions in three languages—English, French, and Spanish—further reinforcing our commitment to inclusivity and international collaboration. The incredible number of abstracts we have already received allows us to anticipate not only a high scientific quality, but also a very strong attendance in Lyon.

While celebrating these achievements, our focus now turns to the opportunities that 2026 presents. One of our biggest challenges, in my view, remains our membership. I would like to sincerely thank the hundreds of you who are paid-up members and actively support the society.

At the same time, there are tens of thousands of European (and not only!) professionals who could be part of SESAM but are not yet members. If we want to have a strong voice, we need to be numerous. Representation matters. I therefore encourage everyone to engage with colleagues and peer groups to encourage them to join or connect with SESAM.

This is closely linked to our advocacy efforts. We have started important work in recent years, and we must expand it further. Our goal is to help build a single, strong, global voice for simulation in healthcare, one that can be heard clearly at institutional and policy levels. We are working intensively at an international level to align efforts and strengthen collaborations.



At the same time, we continue to consolidate SESAM as an organization, not only financially but also administratively and legally, to ensure long-term sustainability and continuity.

Let me conclude by saying that it is easy to achieve these results and plan new ones when you lead such an extraordinary team of colleagues.

None of this would be possible without their passion, professionalism, and commitment. Personally, and on behalf of the entire SESAM community, I thank all the Executive Board Members, Committee and CoP Chairs, and our new Executive Director.

Advances in Simulation: December Publications



Our journal, *Advances in Simulation*, continues to publish cutting-edge research that advances our field. Here are some notable December publications:

"An immersive mirror: a descriptive study of peer observer and active participant experiences in simulation" by Naomi Tutticci, Sandra Johnston, Joanne Ramsbotham, and Karen Theobald explores the valuable perspectives of both observers and participants in simulation-based learning.

"Simulation training for holistic and systematic health needs assessments of older adults: a qualitative study" by Bente Hamre Larsen, Dagruun Naden Dyrstad, Helle K Falkenberg, Peter Dieckmann, and Marianne Storm demonstrates simulation's application in geriatric care education.

"Resolving latent safety threats identified through in situ simulation: a multicentre mixed-methods study" by Jennifer Weller and colleagues exemplifies how simulation directly improves patient safety by identifying and addressing system vulnerabilities.

Special Collection Highlight: The first paper in our special collection "Connecting Simulation with Healthcare Quality and Safety" has been published. This collection bridges the gap between simulation and healthcare improvement practice, accepting submissions until 13 August 2026.
